LETTER TO THE EDITOR

Hi Vince,



I have been enjoying my electronic copies of the Potomac Region newsletter. Thanks for the nice welcome in a recent issue, and I'm sorry to see the recent loss of some longtime members.

I have had a lot of fun driving my '56 Caddy around this past summer. It attracts lots of attention. I met one gentleman at a diner who worked on the Cadillac body and trim line from 1954-69, and as a line supervisor from 1969-85. He was able to provide some interesting information.



In June, my girlfriend and I went to her native Colombia to visit her family and the Amazon River area. We spent a week in Bogota, a city of about eight million with very bad traffic. I kept watching for a Cadillac, but saw nary a sign of the fabled marque during the whole week. I asked a couple people about Cadillac cars, but they didn't seem to have ever heard of that make. The majority of the cars there were smaller Chevys, followed by Renault, some of which were vintage models. There was a good helping of Ford, Toyota and Hyundai models, as well. Large trucks seemed to be mostly Dodge. Gasoline was sold by the gallon (they still have Esso) and was somewhat more expensive, but not a lot. I saw one nice GMC pickup, circa 1950, and one nice Chevy, circa 1960. The only consolation for the dearth of Cadillacs was that the airport is named El Dorado!

One more thing I remember about my trip to Colombia. One Sunday afternoon we went out to a town nearby to Bogota to get some ice cream and look around. I noticed that a lot of people had raised the hoods of their cars and I wondered what was going on. A few minutes later I saw a priest making his way through the crowd, dispensing holy water as he went. Then I noticed he was also sprinkling holy water on the engines of the cars! I thought that was pretty cool.

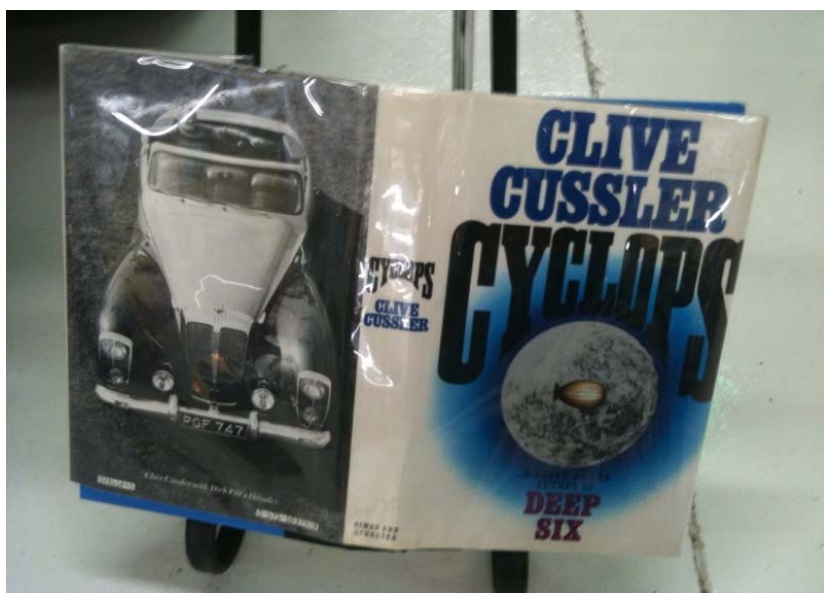


2013 CLC WINTER BOARD MEETING WESTMINSTER (SUBURB OF DENVER), COLORADO STORY & PHOTOS BY JACK MCCLOW

I recently returned home from the Cadillac & LaSalle Club (CLC) and CLC Museum and Research Center (CLCMRC) Winter Board Meetings in Westminster, Colorado. This was my tenth consecutive winter board meeting event. Every single one of them has been as different from the one before, and this year it was certainly no different. Thanks to the tireless efforts and long range planning of Tim Coy, Southwestern Regions VP, and his many, many assistants from the Rocky Mountain Region, we enjoyed three fun-filled and jam packed days of sightseeing, car collection tours, and productive club business activities.

As is the tradition, the CLCMRC board meeting is always held on Friday afternoon and the CLC board meeting is held on Saturday, but many of us have made a custom of arriving a few days early in order to participate in the planned activities the local host region arranges for us. This year, for our pleasure and enjoyment, the Rocky Mountain folks had several events planned for us spread over the three days of our visit.

Thursday January 19th



The touring began Thursday as we traveled by coach to the Clive Cussler Automotive Collection (www.cusslermuseum.com). This private collection of over 100 spectacularly preserved or restored automobiles is owned by the renowned author, Clive Cussler. Many of the cars in his collection have been featured in his books and, when this is the case, a copy of the book can be found sitting on the running board or nearby the featured vehicle (pictured left). This collection is open to the public during the spring through fall months, and should be on everyone's bucket list of things to do.

Our next stop was to see the collection of long-time local region member Rod Brewer, whose amazing variety of mostly Cadillac automobiles encompassed a large range of unique and very interesting vehicles. For those who enjoy non-Cadillac automobiles as well, Rod had a small collection of amazing 1955-56 Chrysler 300 letter cars, one of which was playing music for us through the factory installed under-dash record player. I have seen a number of mid-1950's Chryslers with the somewhat rare record player option, but I have never heard one in action. The sound was actually very amazing, especially considering the age of the equipment. It even knew how to restart the recording on its own; that part in particular I found truly noteworthy.

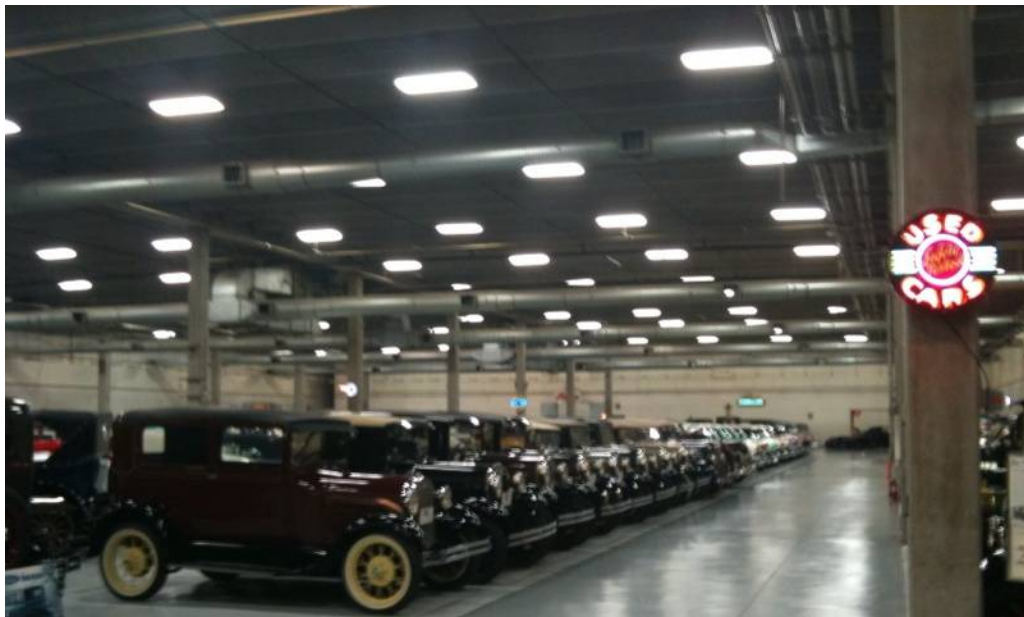

After lunch at a local landmark, we headed to the city to Longmont, Colorado to view the private collection of Stephen Tebo, a local legend in the real estate market, who is unofficially known as the "Donald Trump of Denver." Mr. Tebo has amassed a truly incredible collection of over 400 collector and special interest cars, including a recent addition, the 1964 Cadillac Miller-Meteor Hearse that carried the body of John F. Kennedy from Parkland Hospital to Air Force One at Love Field following his assassination in Dallas (pictured right).

Mr. Tebo's collection is not generally open to members of the public, so I was especially pleased to be able to see all of his amazing vehicles for the first time. I had heard about this collection for many, many years, but was never sure I would have the opportunity to be able to enjoy a tour. In addition to maintaining the perfect environment for the storage and viewing of so many extremely special cars, another unique feature for this special collection is that every single one of the cars in the collection is ready to be driven with no more than a moment's notice.

There is a small circle of colored paper with a special code on it affixed to one of the headlights of each vehicle in the collection. The color of the circle and the code dictate the sequence in which the vehicle is exercised on a quarterly basis. Every single vehicle in Mr. Tebo's collection is removed from the museum every three months and driven on a ten mile course around the area to ensure the vehicle's reliability and road-worthiness. This process is carefully structured by a team of volunteers who have proven their ability to be able to operate a very wide range of vehicle types. I was told the waiting list to be a volunteer for this quarterly adventure is very, very long. If I lived anywhere near the Denver area, I know for sure I would be waiting for a vacancy to open up for myself.

Friday January 20th

On Friday morning we were back on our tour coach once more, this time for a tour of the home of past Denver socialite, Ms. Molly Brown. She is famously known as the "The Unsinkable Molly Brown" for surviving the Titanic shipwreck. "It's a small world" as in our group was our very own Bob Crimmins, whose great uncle, James Crimmins, was a fireman onboard the Titanic. When the order to abandon ship was given, James was sent to man one of the last lifeboats to leave the great ship. Onboard the lifeboat was Mrs. John Jacob Astor. She helped to save Mr. Crimmins from freezing while he was helping to save the others (coming straight out of the boiler room he was wearing only light-weight clothing) by ripping her fur muff in length and wrapping it around him until the Carpathia arrived to rescue them all 4 ½ hours later..



Just a few blocks away from Molly Brown's home is Denver's oldest Cadillac dealership, Rickenbaugh Cadillac (pictured above). It has been at the same downtown site since 1944. Thanks to Service Manager Blaise Flaherty, an active CLC member of the Rocky Mountain Region, we enjoyed a top to bottom guided tour of the facility, parts of which retain some characteristics of the dealership from back to the 1950's. While on tour, we noticed a beautiful early Cadillac in the showroom along with two "elderly" Cadillac automobiles in the service department undergoing routine service. This dealership prides itself on all forms of maintenance for all years of Cadillacs, which helps to maintain the heritage of the most famous of the American luxury cars now as much as it did when it opened its doors almost seventy years ago.

CLC Museum and Research Center Board Meeting

After lunch at the historic Union Pacific Railway station, we headed back to the Westin hotel for the CLC Museum and Research Center executive board meeting. The meeting started promptly at 4:00 PM. The biggest news of the two board meetings that I attended came out of the CLCMRC board meeting. With a near unanimous vote, the board approved a motion to proceed with construction of the new CLCMRC museum at the Gilmore Complex in Hickory Corners. The building will be based upon a 1948 General Motors design (pictured right).

Approval was also given by the board to authorize the contractor, Groves Construction, to proceed with producing a firm contract and build

proposal. It should be noted that this construction firm has already built the Model A Museum (completed this past September) building on the Gilmore grounds, and will most likely be the firm that will build the Lincoln Foundation Museum building that will be adjacent to our CLC building. Construction on the Lincoln building should begin within the next few months. This construction firm has a history of quality construction, excellent workmanship, and no issues concerning cost overruns. The feeling at the CLCMRC board meeting was that the construction of the Cadillac & LaSalle Club museum building should/could benefit, financially, if it is or can be done in conjunction with the construction of the Lincoln museum building as there would be "an economy of scale that might benefit both the contractor and our construction budget" if the two museum buildings could be constructed simultaneously. No exact date for completion was stated, but it is expected that the new CLC museum building should be finished and the museum itself open and running in no more than 18 months. The first step of the process is to spend \$85,000 to have the necessary detailed architectural and engineering specifications and blueprints prepared. Then the contract for the construction will be signed. The estimated cost for construction is not to exceed one million dollars. The CLCMRC has already invested approximately \$26,000 in infrastructure improvements to the building site in anticipation of our construction project.

At the present time, the building fund holds approximately \$600,000 in current assets, with another \$150,000 to be coming in over the next year or two or three as the result of current pledges. It is estimated there could be as much as \$250,000 in additional funds waiting on the sidelines, which will be forthcoming once the construction of our museum building has begun. It is hoped even more donations will be forthcoming once word spreads of the impending construction.

Any shortfall in needed construction funds will be secured via either bank loans or direct loans from CLC members, paid at a 4% annual rate, to be repaid over the span of six years. The thought is based on the assumption that there are many CLC members with certificates of deposits currently paying in the 1% range. As these certificates mature, the hope is that between eight and ten CLC members will opt to purchase, each, a six-year \$25,000 certificate with the CLCMRC at the considerably higher annual rate of 4%.

After the new museum building is constructed and ready to open, it is estimated it will cost approximately \$70,000 per year to operate the CLCMRC on an ongoing basis. This figure does not include any interest payments paid on either the loans held by CLC members or loans from any financial institution that may be used to secure the funds, if additional funds are found to be necessary to finish the construction of the building. The \$70,000 annual operating budget is comprised of:

- 1) \$40,000 for on-going operating expenses paid to Gilmore for basic maintenance of the entire facility, general lighting, payroll and related expenses for the Gilmore staff, and basic lighting costs,
- 2) \$10,000 in utility costs for lighting and HAVC usage, and
- 3) \$20,000 for general operating expenses of the CLCMRC itself

Currently, the CLCMRC has over 6,000 items in the museum's archives, along with 17 automobiles (16 Cadillacs and one LaSalle) ranging in years from 1931 through 1991, and one 1939 chassis.

Other business discussed at the board meeting involved a detailed listing of the significant donations that have already been made to the CLCMRC or donations that will be made as future estates are settled. **As of this time, only approximately two percent of the CLC members have made a donation toward the construction of the new CLCMRC building. There is still time to donate to this worthy cause!** Also, a number of current CLC members have made arrangements to one day donate a variety of items or financial instruments to the CLCMRC, ranging from classic Cadillac and LaSalle automobiles, to literature and memorabilia, to mineral rights designed to benefit the continued future of the CLCMRC.

The next CLC event at the Gilmore Museum will be held the weekend of September 27–29, 2013. This will be the fourth annual CLC Weekend at Gilmore, and it is hoped by the time this event rolls around, a solid beginning to our new CLCMRC building will be well underway.

The Gilmore Museum Complex has been experiencing an unprecedented growth spurt of late. In addition to our own soon-to-open Cadillac & LaSalle Club Museum, there is the recently opened Pierce-Arrow Museum, the recently opened Franklin Museum, the recently opened Model A Museum, and the soon to open Lincoln Foundation Museum, which will be our closest neighbor. Also, the Gilmore Complex has now become a year-around operation thanks the newly opened Automotive Heritage Center which is the new cornerstone for the complex with a new entrance, new and improved parking facilities, and completely new focal point. CLC Board Meeting

At 8:00 AM sharp on Saturday morning, about 40 CLC board members were ready to get started on club business under the direction of CLC President, Dr. Lars Kneller. The meeting went exceptionally smooth. I was pleased to see a number of younger (younger than me anyway) faces sitting around the table who are becoming seriously involved for the first time in club business. I have had a number of discussions with those who worry, with justification I do feel, that clubs such as ours may one day find themselves unable to carry on unless there are new and energetic members ready to come on board and to keep the club going. Well, if I was concerned before I am not so much anymore. It was just wonderful to see a number of newly active members attending the meeting and beginning to have their voices heard.

Approximately six hours of actual business was handled and reports given; too much to go into detail here, but following are what I considered to be the highlight topics:

- Current membership is 7,167. Slightly down from last year, but holding relatively steady. A fine trend considering we have reports from other clubs similar to ours which are experiencing declining membership trends for several years running.
- Revenues (dues) for the most recent fiscal year (ending September 2012) are down somewhat (approximately \$20,000) from the prior fiscal year ending September 2011. This is most likely due to members switching from first class service mail service to the less expensive periodical rate. This is having the expected result of causing the net income to decrease by approximately the same amount, resulting in a loss for the fiscal year just ended of approximately \$15,000 compared to a loss of less than \$1,000 for the previous fiscal year.
- The club is in very good financial shape with liquid assets of approximately \$420,000.
- Due to a combination of steady membership and excellent management of the club's finances, no increase in dues will be necessary or considered for this coming year. Congratulations to all those CLC members who have and continue to manage the club so well.
- Compliments to Richard Sills for his assistance in the area of establishing the definitions for our tax exempt status on our line items.
- The authenticity manual for the 1971-76 Cadillac cars (excepting Eldorado and Seville models) has now been completed and will be available for sale starting next month.
- The authenticity manual for the 1959-60 Cadillac cars will hopefully be completed by the end of 2013.

Those of us who attended the 2012 Winter Board Meetings had the opportunity to experience this grand hotel in advance. This will be a Grand National event you will not want to miss, and for all those of us from the Potomac Region, it will entail a relatively easy drive of approximately 460 miles.
- The 2013 National Driving Tour will be held in June in mid-to-northern California.
- 2014 Grand National will be in Lake George, New York, just this side of the Canadian border.
- 2014 National Driving Tour will be in the northern portion of Indiana.
- 2015 Grand National will be held in the town of Brookfield, Wisconsin, located approximately 14 miles west of Milwaukee.
