

VINTAGE CARS ROLL UP INTO THE DRIVE-IN Report and photos by Tony Albarella

On the blissfully comfortable late-summer evening of Saturday, September 10, Cindy and I joined several dozens of classic car enthusiasts and guests who ventured out into the warm, night air to enjoy a marvelously "retro" event: a good, old-fashioned drive-in movie.


The event, spearheaded by CCNJ director Anthony Vanacore, took place at Demarest Farms in Hillsdle, NJ. It was open to vintage cars of all makes, models and eras, and the public responded: about forty cars arrived to watch AMERICAN GRAFFITI under the stars. Demarest Farms is a quaint farmer's market specializing in pick-your-own peaches, apples, and pumpkins. We, however, weren't there for the produce; the club rented out for the evening the clearing Demarest Farms has prepared for drive-in movies. This little grove is nicely situated on their property and includes a permanent (or at least semi-permanent) drive-in screen, projector, and positional speakers. As a substitute for the lack of individual-car speakers, the organizers broadcast audio through a limited-range signal than can be picked up on nearby car or portable radios.

Since the location was a little further north than most CCNJ events, the trip up from Woodbridge took nearly an hour, but Cindy and I didn't mind. It was a lovely day for cruising in our '59 Thunderbird and we had allotted enough time to arrive early. When we pulled in, Demarest personnel were prepping the movie area and Anthony, Kelly, Michael Cascio, and others in Anthony's family were setting up to hand out the included soda, pizza, and popcorn (which was freshly-popped in a portable cart). We lent a hand then took up a spot as the cars rolled in to park in rows before the movie screen.

Come dusk, after a fun hour or so of vintage intermission and "visit our concession stand" ads, the AMERICAN GRAFFITI screening started. As was often done back in the heyday of the drive-in (the late-1940's to the late-1970's), some attendees remained in their cars for the movie while others set up lawn chairs in front of their cars. We did the latter, and brought a portable radio for sound.

The evening went off splendidly. Many CCNJ members with vintage Cads were there, as were several fresh faces with wonderful classic cars from a range of eras. It was a blast to see a car-culture classic like AMERICAN GRAFFITI, filmed in the 70's but about teens in the 1950's, while surrounded by the kind of vintage steel celebrated in the film. The weather was nearly perfect; the night clear and crisp, the temperature moderate with no need for a heavy sweater or jacket, and either our bug spray worked wonders or the bugs just failed to show up and use drive-in participants as their own concession snacks. If we do this again next year—and I fervently hope we do—be sure not to miss it! 12












































































KRISPY KREME CARS AND COFFEE Report and photos by Anthony Vanacore
