





Excerpts from Tom Pirog's Show Remarks

“...Thirty years has gone by. We've got a great club. We've got great cars. Maybe not the turnout that we look for on a Thursday night but the spirit of the club is still strong. Let's start off with Roy Garretson; a busy man who takes the time, volunteers, always has offered a helping hand, bringing a tent or whatever he can do to help this club...thanks so much, Roy, for your dedication.

“Standing right next to him is Tony Albarella. This guy puts together, every month, one of most quality newsletters of any of our clubs, got the Golden Quill Award and was nominated yet again. Let me tell you something, every other month I put together the Director's Message. Even if it only takes an hour and a half of my time, you still have to spend the time to make it a meaningful message. Well, that's only one part of it. Tony puts together the entire newsletter...think of the time that this guy dedicates every month towards this club to make something to send out to you guys. And when you look at this club, well, we don't get together like this every month, we get together like this twice a year. To do this every month is a big effort. So Tony, thank you for the hard work that you put forward; it's always a quality product and we very much appreciate it.

“Mike Cascio...busy guy, thanks so much for the hard work that you put forward, pulling together some events. Anthony Vanacore, standing next to him on the board, thank you so much. And then, of course, we have the anchors; so as much as we recognize Bob Walton for the thirty years, Lois and Rob Harriman have put together at least twelve or thirteen or fourteen years, you can't get a straight answer on how many years because they're too modest. But they have put forth an effort for this club that is second to...well, second to Bob, in my opinion. We've had many, many people make contributions but for the last thirteen years, Rob and Lois have stepped up to be the director and treasurer of this club and they're doing a great job. Thank you so much for your hard work.

“I just want to point out that sitting in front of me...is Bob Walton. Thank you so much for starting this club up, you mean a lot to us, and it means a lot to us that you came down here today to celebrate with us. We can't thank you enough, Bob. Thank you so much for the service that you've given this club. We would not be here without Bob Walton.”

Bob Walton's Show Remarks

“I would also like to extend my thanks to everyone who has, over the last thirty years, contributed to this club. We've had many, many officers, many who did not hold office but served the club, and every one of them I thank. It's incredible to think that thirty years ago I was 43 years old, and started a club, and now here I am 73 years old and the club is still here. I find that absolutely amazing. So many organizations start up, get going, and then fizzle because somebody drops the ball.

“Thank goodness, there has always been someone willing to step up and say, ‘Yeah, I'll do that’ and get a cadre of people around them to keep it going. I'm hoping that thirty years from now—I'll probably be gone, but I hope the club isn't. I hope there's still a cadre of people willing to do the work and enjoy doing the work. I thank you all for coming. Again, I thank everyone who has ever done anything for the club. It's dozens and dozens of people and I don't want to name any names because I know I'll forget somebody important. But you know who you are who have done what you've done and I thank you all.”



Robert J. Crimmins, 84, of Manalapan, formerly of Laurence Harbor, passed away at home on Sunday May 23, 2021. He worked for the Herbert L. Farkas Co., Newark, NJ, from 1963-2005, rising to VP of Sales. He then worked in sales at Hertz Furniture, Ramsey, NJ, for a number of years before retiring. Robert was a very active person. He loved to travel and cruise, visiting almost 100 different countries as well as 49 of the 50 states. He was a Titanic enthusiast. A prolific model builder, Bob's garage is lined with many shelves of expertly assembled car models as well as Cadillac memorabilia.

Robert's true passion was classic Cadillacs. He was the proud owner of two 1955 Cadillacs and an active member of the Cadillac and LaSalle Club, serving as both the head of the national club's publications committee as well as the Chapter Liaison. He also served as the recording secretary for the Raritan River Region of the Cadillac and LaSalle Club and was a CCNJ member from 1995-2002.

Donald Francis McCarthy passed away on March 7, 2020, at the age of 81. Born to Helen and John McCarthy, Sr., on February 26, 1939, he graduated from Cardinal Hayes High School and Iona College. After serving in the U.S. Navy on the U.S. Recovery from 1958-1963, he joined the New York Police Department, where he retired as Detective of the Bronx Task Force in 1982. After his marriage to Civita Acocella in May of 1982, they moved to Paramus, NJ; where Donald became Director of Security for Bergen County's Bergen Pines.

Donald is predeceased by his parents, brothers John, Jr. and Vincent, and sister Patricia Sammy. He is survived by his beloved wife Civita, brothers-in-law Timothy Sammy, Vincent Acocella, and Robert Doucette and sisters-in-law Catherine McCarthy, Geraldine Doucette, Carmela Acocella, and Jean Acocella. Donald was a cherished uncle to his 23 nieces and nephews, 38 great-nieces and nephews, and 6 great-great-nieces and nephews.
